Work Team Supplies

Groups will be divided into work teams of 8-10 people per work site.

Each work team will need to provide the following:

- Transportation to and from the housing site to the worksite. (Two teams can use one vehicle if necessary)
- First Aid Kit.
- Two drink coolers, (e.g. Igloo water jug) and one ice chest for each worksite.

Adult Leaders

A 1:6 ratio of adult to student per gender is necessary. Each adult must complete a background check and oversee his or her own students

Our Story

In the summers of 2009 and 2011, the student ministry of Dauphin Way UMC served with Service Over Self (SOS) in Memphis, TN. The ministry involved repairing damaged and leaky roofs in a neighborhood similar in demographics to the South Broad Street neighborhoods in Mobile. Teams returned from these mission experiences realizing that Mobile had a similar need and asked, “why are we not doing something...?” The vision for Raise the Roof Project grew from that question.

The South Broad Street area has historical significance to the city of Mobile, but is now known more for crime and urban poverty. Organizations such as United Methodist Inner City Mission and Taylor Park Community Center seek to restore hope to the neighborhoods through community programming, afterschool tutoring, and a homeless shelter for women. It was through these efforts, particularly the children’s programming, that students at Dauphin Way and St. Paul’s first came to know the people of the area.

The shelter and children’s programming address important needs. The sub-standard living conditions of families in the area is a stark reality not being addressed. Mobile is among the wettest cities in the nation and has an annual threat of hurricanes. A dry home is often a safe haven for families and neighbors. God has called us to serve these people.

Luke 5:17-26—One day Jesus was teaching, and Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there. They had come from every village of Galilee and from Judea and Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal the sick. Some men came carrying a paralyzed man on a mat and tried to take him into the house to lay him before Jesus. When they could not find a way to do this because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and lowered him on his mat through the tiles into the middle of the crowd, right in front of Jesus. When Jesus saw their faith, he said, “Friend, your sins are forgiven.” The Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, “Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?” Jesus knew what they were thinking and asked, “Why are you thinking these things in your hearts? Which is easier: to say, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Get up and walk?’ But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.” So he said to the paralyzed man, “I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home.” Immediately he stood up in front of them, took what he had been lying on and went home praising God. Everyone was amazed and gave praise to God. They were filled with awe and said, “We have seen remarkable things today.”

The hole in the roof is the avenue for the friends and the paralyzed man to get to Jesus. The paralyzed man needs healing and forgiveness; the friends need to provide support and compassion; and everyone there that day is filled with awe at seeing God’s grace for the paralyzed man.

In some cases, the homeowner will be the paralyzed soul. For others, the mission team may need the healing. The roof is the entry point into the hearts and lives of those who need to experience the grace, healing and love of Jesus!

God has called us to participate in His great purpose of drawing people into relationship with Him. Our hope is that each volunteer who serves, each contributor, each neighbor who wonders why teenagers are on top of the house, and each homeowner will be drawn into a closer relationship with Jesus Christ.
